## Women gatherer with ending (3'07) Daniela Zorrozua (chewing) (rustling) (chewing) (rustling steps) (squeal) (running) (grunt) (narrator) We are all familiar with the idea of the man hunter, (crunch) (injured cry) which was almost an exclusively male activity. (tapping) But what we just saw is an exception, as studies have always shown that hunting was inefficient as a means of providing food. Meat from the kill comes in irregularly and infrequently. (munching)

(slurping) (flies buzzing) Meat cannot easily be stored, especially in hot weather. Men hunters provided just 20 percent of the tribes' total food intake. (wrench working) On the other hand, women's gathering demanded knowledge, selection, and memory. (thud) It also provided the impetus for the first human experiments with technology, as these women created the first tools to facilitate their daily work. Hunting and its weapons were a much later development. Women gatherers produced the other 80 percent of the food, and sustained the tribe on a daily basis. (thud) (sigh) At no point in prehistory did women, with or without their children, rely on their hunting males for food. (munching)
